We prayed for the departed souls, for the sick and injured, for the homeless, for the bereaved, and for those still searching for their loved ones in this great tragedy. Within couple of hours of this misfortune calamity, ANTA Executive committee called an emergency meeting and started collecting funds through <u>https://.gofundme.com/</u> <u>nepalfloodvictimfund</u> and started working actively with all its efforts in the relief program to help the flood victims.

A Candlelight Vigil and the Prayers for the Flood Victims were organized by ANTA's DC Chapter on August 16, 2017 in Durga temple located at 8400 Durga PI, Fairfax Station, VA 22039. This event was organized under the leadership of ANTA DC Chapter President and the Event coordinator Mr. Anil Dwivedi. The news has been covered and published in several media.

We are away from Nepal and thus any experience like this is worth a lot.





We truly thank each and every participant and attendee for their valuable time and efforts at the picnic. We couldn't have done it without everyone's support.

ANTA in collaboration with Koshish Foundation magnificently provided relief materials including health services and medicines to flood affected families of Brahmpuri village of Rautahat district. There were 93 relief packages, each contains Rs. 3,000 worth of essentials. The medical team comprised of 10 doctors also provided medical services and medicines to around 250 patients from the flood affected areas.

In addition, the team also organized a health camp to provide medical services and medicines to flood victims of Belhi and Tilathi villages of Saptari District. The area our team served was almost an island and other organization(s) before us refused to go there as they did not want to wade through the river. ANTA in collaboration with Koshish Foundation was able to provide effective health services and medicines to around 500 affected people in the area.





ANTA in collaboration with Pahal Nepal delivered the needed supplies in a timely manner to the flood victims of Rajdevi Municipality of Rautahat District. The relief package included 20 kg Rice, 5 kg Potato, 1 kg Lentil, 1 kg Salt, 1/2 liter Oil, and 1 Mosquito Net. Please see the photos of our relief program provided below.



We want to express our sincerest gratitude to Mr. Uday Yadav, the younger brother of our Executive Committee Member, Mr. Mohan Yadav, who performed an excellent task on behalf of ANTA in Saptari District. With assistance from family and friends, Mr. Yadav distributed a small amount from ANTA's relief fund in villages of Saptari, to the flood victims who desperately required attention. His perseverance set an exemplar for all of us to follow on how to serve our community without any self-interest. ANTA follows the same ideal displayed by Mr. Yadav, which is serving our people without any self-interest. Hence, we welcome all our community members to come join us and serve our people.







ANTA in collaboration with Madhesh Initiatives successfully completed the distribution of relief materials to the flood victims (25 households in Mushar & Jhangar Basti) of Bokraha Gaaun Palika - 6 of Sunsari District. The relief package included 20-kg Rice, 2-kg Lentil, 1-liter Oil, 1-kg Salt, 1 Tripal (Canopy), 2 T-Shirts for kids, 5-liter drinking Water, 1 Bucket, 1 Jug, and Cooking Utensils. ANTA in collaboration with THRD Alliance successfully distributed relief materials and provided health services to the flood victims. This has been published at http://thrda.org/thrd-alliance- collaborated-various-organisations-individuals-help-flood-victims/.



ANTA in collaboration with Sano Paila successfully distributed relief and support in five most affected districts by flood. Affected people were provided with Tarps, food, mosquito nets, sanitary items, medicines and new clothes focusing on the families who have lost their houses, pregnant mothers, children and elderly. Besides, Sano Paila also mobilized its volunteers under Local Youth Project (LYV) in districts: Sunsari, Jhapa and Saptari in serving the relief materials to the affected people. The families who lost their houses, children affected, pregnant mother were in the priority list in all 5 affected districts. The number of beneficiaries were: Parsa 95 families, Bara 163 families, Rautahat 100 families, Dhanusha 80 families, Mahottari 80 families









Terai Community Development Foundation has been organizing medical camps as well as distributing flood relief materials to flood affected areas of Rautahat to needy one and their community.
